



Working with Children & Adolescents Who Engage in Sexually Abusive Behaviours

This training will focus on how to work with children and adolescents who engage in Sexually Abusive Behaviours (SAB) within the Therapeutic Treatment Orders Framework utilising a Trauma/Attachment/Brain Developmental model. Dr. Russell Pratt will present a brief overview of the recent changes to the framework for the treatment of children and youth with SAB issues, as well as a treatment model incorporating community management principles. Practical examples will be utilised on the day and will involve some audience participation.

Seminar Objectives:

- To define sexually abusive behaviour (what is/what isn't) and language to use or not use
- To gain understanding of the underlying theories in regards to treatment of sexually abusive youth: what's hot and what's not?
- To incorporate child developmental knowledge into our practice; what's normal and what's not?
- Sexually abusive behaviours versus sex offending
- Trauma/attachment/brain development: how this paradigm is useful in treatment
- To look at Therapeutic Treatment Order legislation and why it's good news for families
- To walk away with practical strategies in regards to assessment and/or treatment
- To separate or not? When is the risk too high to others for a young person to stay in the home

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Dr. Russell Pratt BA (Hons), DPsych, Adv Dip Bus Man, is a state-wide Principal Practitioner with DHS. Prior to this he was the manager and senior clinician of South Eastern Centre Against Sexual Assault (SECASA) AWARE program for three years. Russell has worked for more than a decade in the field of sexual assault, both with victims/survivors and with youth exhibiting sexually problematic behaviours and sexually abusive behaviours. He is a past chairman of the Victorian Offender Treatment Association (VOTA) and was the recipient of the 2008 Creswick Foundation Fellowship in Child Development and Family Relationships.
